Job speaks of the severity his suffering

•Job 6:1-3 (NIV)

- ¹Then Job replied:
- ² "If only my anguish could be weighed and all my misery be placed on the scales!
- ³ It would surely outweigh the sand of the seas no wonder my words have been impetuous.

Job speaks of the severity his suffering

•Job 6:4 (NIV)

- ⁴ The arrows of the Almighty are in me, my spirit drinks in their poison; God's terrors are marshalled against me.
- Does a wild donkey bray when it has grass, or an ox bellow when it has fodder?

Job speaks of the severity his suffering

•Job 6:6 (NIV)

- ⁶ Is tasteless food eaten without salt, or is there flavour in the white of an egg?
- •⁷ I refuse to touch it; such food makes me ill.

Job solicits God for death

•Job 6:8-9 (NIV)

⁸ "Oh, that I might have my request, that God would grant what I hope for, ⁹ that God would be willing to crush me, to let loose his hand and cut me off!

Job solicits God for death

- •Job 6:10 (NLT)
 - ¹⁰ At least I can take comfort in this...
- •...despite the pain, I have not denied the words of the Holy One.

Job solicits God for death

•Job 6:11-13 (NIV)

- 11 "What strength do I have, that I should still hope? What prospects, that I should be patient?
 12 Do I have the strength of stone? Is my flesh bronze?
- ¹³ Do I have any power to help myself, now that success has been driven from me?

1. Genuine friends are committed in support

•Job 6:14 (NIV)

¹⁴ "A despairing man should have the devotion of his friends, even though he forsakes the fear of the Almighty.

2. Genuine friends are reliable not inconsistent

Job 6:15-17 (NIV)

- ¹⁵ But my brothers are as undependable as intermittent streams, as the streams that overflow
- ¹⁶ when darkened by thawing ice and swollen with melting snow,
- ¹⁷ but that cease to flow in the dry season, and in the heat vanish from their channels.

Job 6:21 (NIV)

²¹ Now you too have proved to be of no help; you see something dreadful and are afraid.

4. Genuine friends attempt much but do the minimum at least

•Job 6:22-23 (NIV)

Have I ever said, 'Give something on my behalf, pay a ransom for me from your wealth, ²³ deliver me from the hand of the enemy, ransom me from the clutches of the ruthless'?

5. Genuine friends give truthful instructions

Job 6:24-25 (NIV)

- ²⁴ "Teach me, and I will be quiet; show me where I have been wrong.
- ²⁵ How painful are honest words! But what do your arguments prove?

- 6. Genuine friends listen carefully not judge carelessly
- Job 6:26 (MSG)
 - ²⁶ You pretend to tell me what's wrong with my life, but treat my words of anguish as so much hot air.
- Job 6:26 (NLT)
 - ²⁶ Do you think your words are convincing when you disregard my cry of desperation?

- Job 6:27 (NIV)
 - ²⁷ You would even cast lots for the fatherless and barter away your friend.
- Job 6:27 (MSG)
 - ²⁷ Are people mere things to you? Are friends just items of profit and loss?

- Job 6:28-30 (NIV)
 - ²⁸ "But now be so kind as to look at me. Would I lie to your face?
- ²⁹ Relent, do not be unjust; reconsider, for my integrity is at stake.
- ³⁰ Is there any wickedness on my lips? Can my mouth not discern malice?
